

Getting to the venue


Closest bus stop - Clarke St/Johnston St (Route 200/207)

The bus is the easiest way to access the Farm on public transport. Take the 200 or 207 to the Clarke St/Johnston St stop. From here, it's a 5 minute walk to the venue.



Closest train station - Victoria Park

The closest train station is Victoria Park, accessible by the Mernda or Hurstbridge lines. It's a 15 minute walk to the Farm from this stop.



Closest tram stop - Kew Junction/High St

It's not advisable to take the tram to the festival, as it's a 36 minute walk!

Parking

There is a paid parking area on St Heliers Street, right next to the venue. If you are driving, we suggest you carpool.

Main entrance - 1700mm wide. Asphalt, some uneven brickwork.



Front entrance second passageway - 2680mm wide.
Asphalt changing to gravel.



Walk to ticket box, asphalt and some gravel, interchanging.



Entrance to ticket box - 1650mm wide, asphalt changing to boardwalk, relatively even.



Exit from ticket booth - 1350mm wide. Boardwalk continuing down a gentle decline ramp. Ramp is 1850mm wide.



Base of ramp opens out to a gravelled area.



Accessible toilet ramp is 1200mm narrowing to 1100mm at the top. Cement.



Top of ramp is a brickwork area, leading to accessible toilet.



Accessible toilet door is 860mm wide.



Top entrance to barn (food area), has a passageway that is 1450mm wide. Gravel changing to brickwork with some unevenness.



Entrance to barn / barn doors are 2400mm wide, with brickwork floor.



Lower barn entrance is 1930mm wide, walkway changing from gravel to tiling and cement. Some unevenness .



Rear entrance to barn is 2250mm wide, with very uneven bluestone changing to cement. Some hay around also.



Walkway to paddock (main stage) is gravelled, and gate at the end is 3300mm wide.



Paddock gate leads to tanbark and grass.



Tanbark leads to quite coarse gravel, may be challenging for wheelchairs or scooters.



Exit gate is 3000mm wide when opened. Gravelled.
